We reduced our carbon footprint and established the UU congregation on Shaker Boulevard as a leader committed to making a difference in a challenging environment. We've done many other things over the past decade, including the merger of two UU congregations that resulted in the creation of UUCC, to connect and reconnect our congregants with each other and the larger community.
